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**Nathan Coley: *You Create What You Will and Tate Modern on Fire*
(14 June 2025 –1 March 2026)**

Artworks *You Create What You Will* (2014) and *Tate Modern on Fire* (2017), by Turner prize nominee and Glasgow based artist Nathan Coley, are set to exhibit outside and inside The Bowes Museum, County Durham respectively from 14 June 2025 - 1 March 2026.

Both works exemplify Coley's distinctive artistic practice, which interrogates public space and examines how systems of personal, social, religious and political belief shape our towns, cities and ultimately, our sense of self. **As a museum dedicated to artists, designers and makers, the museum offers a fitting context for this critical exploration**, providing a space where visitors are invited to question the nature of art, its role within society and their own relationship to it.

On the museum's grounds, visitors will first see Coley's *You Create What You Will*, a piece of illuminated text on a scaffolding support around five and a half metres high. Coley's installation, set against the backdrop of the museum's parkland perched high on the grass bank, invites viewers to question the profound power of creation and draw parallels between the installation and the museum's founders' mission of supporting and uplifting artists. The text references Bernard Shaw's play, *In the Beginning: B.C. 4004*, which is a symbolic satirical tale of Adam and Eve, exploring the biblical narrative of creation.

Within the museum, visitors will be able to see *Tate Modern on Fire*, an architectural abstract model of the London museum. From the front, 2D flames emerge from the museum's boiler house, while from the open back, elements associated with the museum are displayed, such as a cabinet of curiosities. The piece reflects on the fragility of cultural institutions and the precarious relationship between museums and society, art and the environment.

Artist, Nathan Coley said: "I'm excited to have my work displayed at The Bowes Museum. The museum's history and outdoor space make it an interesting place for my art to connect with visitors. My work is all about exploring the places we live and the stories they tell, so it will be intriguing to see how people engage with it here."

Senior Programme Manager at The Bowes Museum, George Harris expressed: "We are delighted to present Nathan Coley's thought-provoking art at The Bowes Museum. Coley's work invites us to reflect on the relationship between language and visual image and how we construct wider meaning. His art has been on display across the world, and having these two artworks at the museum encourages the viewer to think about our founder's intentions."

The use of the 'readymade,' a term coined in the early 20th century by Marcel Duchamp to describe the ordinary manufactured objects that artists choose and modify, is central to Coley's work. In both artworks, he refers to objects that already exist, in this case, Bernard Shaw's play and the Tate Modern. **The re-contextualisation of recognisable places and words means that the artworks are ambiguous and open to multiple interpretations from every viewer.**

Nathan Coley's works are on display *You Create What You Will* (2014) and *Tate Modern on Fire* (2017) from 14 June 2025 till 1 March 2026.

He spans a diverse range of media, including sculpture, installation, photography and video. Coley's works often involve large-scale, immersive installations that transform spaces and invite interaction.

Coley was nominated for the Turner prize in 2007 and has exhibited extensively both nationally and internationally. Highlights include *Tate Modern on Fire* exhibited at the Parafin Gallery in 2017 and the Scottish National Gallery of Modern Art in 2017, as well as *You Create What You Will* displayed at the Abu Dhabi Public Art Biennale in 2024 and Roche Court Sculpture Park in 2015.
